- I find it difficult to To not be next to my dad, even when he's in the toilet! I also find it hard to not bark at the "ring chime" on my dad's phone!




My dog got matted over the weekend

High quality training and advice in a place your dog already feels at home, Underdog's group classes are a great way to learn some new skills or sharpen some old ones.


Running Saturday mornings from 9AM Head to the Underdog website to book your spot.



Does your dog struggle with recall, this common issue can he improved with a few changes to your training.

- Avoid letting your dog practice not coming back.
 Set them up for success and keep them on lead if your unsure.
- 2. Turn it into a game. Play chasing games to reinforce your recall.
- 3. Practice more often in all kinds of environments.
- 4. Recall more often, ask your dog to come back, then return to play. Show them recall doesn't mean the end of good times.





Dogs, Translated!

Displacement Behaviours.

A displacement behaviour can be many different things, think of it is an out of context behaviour in place of a big feeling. A common one is your pup bringing you a toy (that you can't actually have) when you come home at night,

It may also look like yawning, scratching or sniffing in a situation where those behaviours don't fit, as a way to cope with stress.

Like stopping play to scratch themselves continually.
